Accessing JTL learning systems

Smart Assessor Learning Materials

It is really important to stay in touch with your tutor and do your best to complete any work they set for you. Whether you learn at a JTL centre or one of our partner colleges, we also have learning materials for your qualification for you to access in Smart Assessor. Find them by clicking on the orange 'resources' widget and looking for Qualification resources. If there is a specific topic you would like to revise, ask your training officer to guide you to the appropriate unit



Functional Skills

The government have not yet made a decision on whether learners will receive 'teacher assessed' grades for functional skills (as per the previous lockdown) or not. As soon as we have more information, we will let you know.

Until these decisions are made, great news is that there are ways to sit your Functional Skills tests. If you have the IT equipment to do so (laptop/computer and tablet/phone), you can do the test 'remotely' at a suitable place (at home or in a work office). If not, you may be asked to attend a JTL centre to complete your test. If you cannot sit your test remotely or attend a JTL centre, then we need to wait until we have a decision from Ofqual on what the option is in this situation.

It is important that you continue to work through your bksb learning and complete the progress checks to show that you are developing your maths/English skills and work through practice tests. Remember we have a dedicated Functional Skills team who are here to support you in preparation for your Functional Skills achievement. When you are contacted by your Functional Skills Trainer, you must respond and ensure you are available to attend learning with them. They will be making contact with you (phone, text, email) over the coming weeks to give you details of a plan for your Functional Skills. They will also give you a date (month) when you are targeted to sit your Functional Skills test. You can speak to your Functional Skills Trainer or Training Officer on the testing options available to you.

Chinese New Year

If you take a look at JTL's Inclusion and Safeguarding Calendar, you will see that February this year makes reference to Chinese New Year

Also known as the Spring Festival, the new moon on 12 Feb 2021 marks the start of the new year in the Lunar Calendar that is typically celebrated in China and other Asian countries. Whilst each country has its own traditions and celebrations that are steeped in local legends, that are very important to the way that people mark Seollal (South Korea), Tet (Vietnam) and Losar (Tibet), the most commonly spoken about ones in the UK tend to relate to Chinese New Year.

Whilst the way that the start of the Year of the Ox will be celebrated around the world may well look different this year, Chinese Astrologers say that people born in the year of the Ox are characterised as being diligent, hard-working and dependable, with an ability to keep calm that can make them great leaders

You will be familiar with people talking about Chinese New Year being characterised by one of the 12 animals that appear in the Chinese Zodiac with the animal changing each year – but do you know how that came about?

According to an ancient Chinese folk story, the Jade Emperor called 13 animals to a meeting where they announced that the years of the calendar would be named according to the order that they arrived in. This led to a 'Great Race' where the Rat came in first, and, after stopping for a nap (!) the Pig came in last. Sadly, the Cat never made it...
